- **Lake Superior National Marine Conservation Area** is Nipigon's most remarkable natural gift. Thriving in or around its clear, fresh waters are an abundance of marine life, plants, rare birds and other wildlife species, as well as hundreds of picturesque islands and freshwater beaches. Learn about the natural wonders of the area through a variety of recreational and interpretive experiences, while helping to conserve the area's extraordinary environment for the future.
- **Lake Nipigon & The Nipigon River** are natural destinations of choice for camping, hiking and fishing enthusiasts and is the site of the world famous, world-record-holding Speckle Trout. The largest ever caught!

Visitors can breathe in the fresh air of the boreal forests that surround Nipigon Lake and River and marvel at the majestic waterfalls, canoe routes and unusual green-black and red ochre sand beaches found along their shores and islands.

Nipigon Marina and Campground



The marina is protected by a natural channel of cliffs and forests and offers spectacular views over the Lake Superior coastline.

From June to September each year, Nipigon Marina is capable of accommodating boats of any size and a multitude of facilities to greet arrivals at the waterfront, from gasoline fill up and showers, to pump out service and overnight docking.

After docking, visitors are invited to collect a certificate from the Township of Nipigon to recognize that they crossed the earth's 49th Parallel.

Visitors to Nipigon will discover pristine shorelines, majestic provincial parks and unspoiled conservation areas that offer varied and year-round activities, from the gentle to the adrenaline-fuelled.

- In Nipigon visitors will find a variety of accommodations, dining and shopping services, in addition to family-focused attractions and outdoor recreational activities.
- Other local highlights include; a 10 kilometre hiking trail between Nipigon and Red Rock, spectacular lookouts over the Lake Superior National Marine Conservation Area and the interactive displays of the Nipigon Historical Museum.
- Nipigon is also a convenient stepping stone to Ouimet Canyon Provincial Park and its famous sky-level viewing platforms, walkways and interpretive displays.
